Richard King, Great Pepper Old Dominion Pod, moved to grant Territorial Opens to St. Thomas, St. Croix, and San Juan Puerto Rico, with top three cooks automatically qualifying for Terlingua. Second by Mike Baldwin. Passed - Unanimous.

President Jones asked for a straw vote on the issue of a monthly Newspaper. The majority chose not to have one.
