Stop Rocking, Start Rowing

Over the last two months, there have been some big happenings in CASI. Some of these have been major positives, and others have led to some very low lights. While I have not been one to use this article in a manor to publicly address the low lights, these few disturbances have changed that course.

First, there has been a lot of negative comments made about the CASI National Scholarship Program and why CASI is not giving more scholarships. As a reminder, the CASI Scholarship fund has a limited amount of money that it can distribute each year. For many years, the Board awarded the full amount of scholarships each year that the fund would allow. This, coupled with a decrease in donations to the fund, shows a downward trend that could bankrupt this program in short order.

Three years ago, the Board took a hard look at this trend and started scaling back the number of scholarships awarded to ensure that this program maintained its viability into the future. This program is the crown jewel of our organization, and garners the most favor with our current and potential sponsors. Corporations are not as willing to fund TICC as they have been in the past, but having the Scholarship Program as the beneficiary of the Friday events strengthens our ability to recruit and retain sponsors.

At the 2018 GPM meeting, Keith Karaff and Michael Mayorga pledged to match, dollar for dollar, any entry fees for Junior Cookoffs that were billed as Kids Cooking for Kids events, where the CASI National Scholarship Program was the charity for the Junior event. This has been communicated extensively through articles in the *Trails*, emails directly to Great Peppers, and the CASI Social Media sites, yet we still have Junior events that are not utilizing this generous offer.

So many individuals say that, "Children are our future and we have to have more junior events in order to show that this organization is family oriented."

Well, why are there not more Junior events, and why aren't the ones being scheduled taking advantage of this matching program to help grow our Scholarship Program? If we want to see more scholarships awarded, or the potential for scholarship money to increase, then we need your help! Run a Junior Cookoff at your next pod cookoff, buy more scholarship day raffle tickets, and SUPPORT YOUR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM!

The second problem is the growth of CASI, or lack thereof. At the summer Board Meeting, we heard two stories of people who had reached out to their local Great Peppers because they had a venue to run a new cookoff, and they were ignored. These two people fortunately reached out to a Director for more information, and were provided guidance on both how to become a CASI member, and the appropriate steps to take as they work to bring a new cookoff online.

CASI members, we have got to be proactive!! This organization is going to continue to grow or it will die, based on the EFFORT that is put forth by our volunteers. The CASI Board has provided flyers, brochures, banners,

and incentives to encourage you to take an active role in the recruitment of new members. We have pointed out areas like the Mid-Atlantic and pods like the Show-Me Pod that are trying new locations and recruiting new cooks, venues, and partners. There has even been the creation of Cooking for CASI Cookoffs, which DO NOT COUNT against your state totals to encourage more cookoffs.

While these are only a few examples of "a fly in the ointment" and not indicative of the entire organization, this should serve as a reminder that we cannot become complacent as a membership base. We must work together to ensure that this organization continues to grow, succeed and thrive.

CASI has become the preeminent chili organization through hard work and striving towards common goals. The growth and success will continue only if we continue putting forth effort. I will leave you with a quote from Jean-Paul Sartre: "Only the guy who isn't rowing has time to rock the boat." If you are rocking, it's time to help the rest of us by rowing!







Make No Mistake!

This month I'll start with a question from the mailbag. Three months ago I touched on this subject while discussing the word "open."

I believe most people understand that Open Championships must be open to an unlimited number of cooks. However, all other cookoffs must be open to a minimum of 50 cooks.

So, make no mistake, a cookoff promoter may restrict the number of cooks, but that number is 50. Actually, in my area, that would be a wonderful problem to have.

I had hoped to deal with the residency issue as it pertained to state championships first. However, a question regarding the number of points required for TICC qualification came up recently. As I've previously stated, the Rules Committee does not make the rules or policies; we just interpret them.

The following is a guideline for the Rules Committee and Tallymaster to aid us when these residency questions arise. As always, each case will be examined and judged on its own merits. (This is a little complicated, but it will help you fall asleep.)

When a cook or show captain (a "person") relocates from one state to another with a different point requirement, we want to be as fair as we can when giving them an opportunity to qualify for TICC, while still maintaining some competitiveness.

I have heard it said that where you reside on the first day of the chili year determines your point requirement. That's not fair – if you moved from a six-point state to a 12-point state a week into the season, say October 5, you would have no chance to qualify. So, we have come up with some guidelines to make things equitable for all cooks and show teams.

When a person moves from a state with a lower point requirement than the state to which he is moving, we want to give him a chance to earn his TICC qualification. Therefore, if the move is made during the first third of the chili year (October 1 to February 1), the person would have ample time to accumulate the number of points required by his new residence, and he would be subject to the new point requirement. If he relocates after February 1, he retains the point requirement of his previous residency.

If a person moves from a state with a higher point requirement than the state to which he is moving, and the move is during the final third (after July 1) of the chili year, he has had ample time to get points in his old state and his point requirement status would not change until the start of the new chili year.

If the move was made during the first third of the year, he may not have had the opportunity to earn enough points to qualify in his previous state, so his point requirement would be adjusted to that of his new resident state. This could result in that person becoming qualified upon moving, but that's okay.

Finally, if you're still awake, let me say the third-of-a-year time periods are arbitrary, and may be adjusted if necessary. They are a starting point.

But, make no mistake, if you relocate, please let the Membership Director and Tallymaster know of the move and when it was made. We want to include everyone possible, and we do not want to penalize anyone, so each case will be evaluated on an individual basis.




