Pennsylvania and Virginia Crown State Champions

Mid-Atlantic state championships make for a hot June, in more ways than one!

YORK SPRINGS PA– After a three-year hiatus, the Pennsylvania State Championship has returned! It has found a new home at the Latimore Valley Fair, "a summer tradition where the old mingles with the new." Cooks were treated to an antique tractor parade, live music, a classic car show and lots of great food and sweets. Sixteen cooks from Pennyslvania, Delaware, Maryland and Virginia collectively traveled 1,163 miles each way to reach cooking site in the grassy infield of the dirt racetrack that is part of the benefiting charity, the Eastern Museum of Motor Racing.

CULPEPER VA–The Virginia State Championship returned to Old House Vineyards again this year. Old House is nestled at the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains and features a winery, a distillery, a brewery (including authentic Irish pub) and great food making this location one of the Mid-Atlantic cooks' favorite places

to share a little "fellowship" with their chili brothers and sisters.

Cooks traveling from North and South Carolina, Virginia and Pennsylvania raised a record \$800 slinging People's Choice Chili to a hungry crowd. The proceeds were split between Fisher House and the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network.

main objective was to cover the costs associated with TICC awards. On the FoC website page, it also states: "In addition, proceeds received over the cost of

The Board and I are appreciative of those who step up and participate in this program, which ultimately benefits CASI members.





The fire marshal concluded that the cause of the fire was undetermined, and there was no evidence that it was malicious or started intentionally. TFEMS, BBNP, and BCSO did a tremendous job in putting out the fire. Brewster County Roads and Bridges have generously given their time in assisting with the clean-up. Our building will be replaced this June through the district's insurance.

The school has ordered and replaced all students' instruments that were lost in the fire with the donations that we have received. 

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


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

Make No Mistake: Pull a Sheet? Or Not?

The disregarding or, "pulling" of a judge's judging sheet is not something that should be done lightly. That judge, in most cases, has been invited to judge by the head judge and/or the cook-off promoter. *Make no mistake, their opinion of the chili has been requested and therefore should be considered.*

This subject is not addressed in the rules section of the CASI 2022-2024 Rules Book, but it is mentioned on page 25 in Section XI "Guidelines for Cook-off Officials". Guideline XI.B.4c states, "If for any reason a judge is thought not to be qualified for judging, that judge's sheet will be held and referred to the head judge for review and final decision."

The table monitor has a pretty good idea from observing the judging process of a judge who may not be paying attention, not

following the instructions, or maybe even drunk. When collecting the judging sheets, the monitor may notice that too many, or not enough cups were judged. If the monitor sees that each cup has a different score, there is a pretty good chance the judge was trying to rank the cups, especially if there were more than ten cups. These kinds of errors should not attempted to be corrected because you are relying on the judge's memory.

What if a judge tells you they don't like chili? You have to wonder why they are here. But that is certainly a reason to believe the judge is not qualified to judge chili. Now, to avoid embarrassing them, you could allow them to judge, but not turn their sheet over to tally, if the head judge concurs.

I am aware of instances where the tally crew has pulled sheets because of low scores. Make no mistake, that should not happen. No one likes to see low scores especially on a final table. I'm sure most of us have been victims of that situation. However, if the table monitor has approved that sheet for tabulation, it should be tallied. And, if possible, that judge should not be invited back. **Bill Pierson**






