



on committees, communicate regularly with your members, share the Minutes of the Board and Great Peppers' Meetings, volunteer to work at TICC. Ask "why don't we" rather than "why did we".

If you have issues or questions regarding something the Board has done or didn't do, or especially the budget, contact us in a timely manner. Do not wait months to address the issue.

When I attended my first TICC in 1984, we cooked at Villa de la Mina on property we didn't own. CASI had the opportunity to purchase property and there were those who felt it was a bad choice. Look at where we are today. What if change had never happened?

When we began cooking at Rancho CASI de los Chisos, there the bands played Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights; the concession stand and bar were only open Thursday through Saturday. Make No Mistake: Secure those turned-in cups!

October is an exciting time of year. It is the beginning of a new chili year where we lose all the points we worked so hard over the past twelve months to accumulate. But we get to start out fresh on a new journey acquiring points for

TICC in 2024. Good luck to all the cooks.

CASI Rule II.E.3 tells us that when cups are turnedin for judging, they are to be placed in boxes or insulated containers (coolers). Make no mistake, this rule is necessary to maintain the security of the cups throughout the judging *process.* The rule goes on to say that the containers must be large enough to hold twelve cups. I'm not sure how that number was arrived at, but since the minimum number of chilis to be judged, for a sanctioned cookoff is fifteen, twelve seems a tad low. The rule also states the containers must be higher than the cups

they are holding, and be covered at all times. All these requirements would suggest coolers. But that would require a whole lot of coolers for large cook-offs.


For those of us in the northern latitudes, coolers did make sense. But even providing coolers for moderate size cook-offs became a problem. Larger cook-offs in Texas started using chicken boxes. They were coated and could be broken down for convenient storage. They became a hot commodity and eventually became hard to find. About fifteen years ago, CASI obtained, through one of our sponsors, a large quantity


of coated boxes that met the requirements and broke down for storage. I am sure you have seen and used them. However, over the course of the last fifteen years, many of these boxes have been damaged, lost, or just plain worn out. It might be a good time to start looking for a new supply of the receptacles.

Turn-in containers are an important part of a cook-off. Make no mistake, they must be used for security and convenience.

I hope everyone has a successful and fun 2024 chili year.


