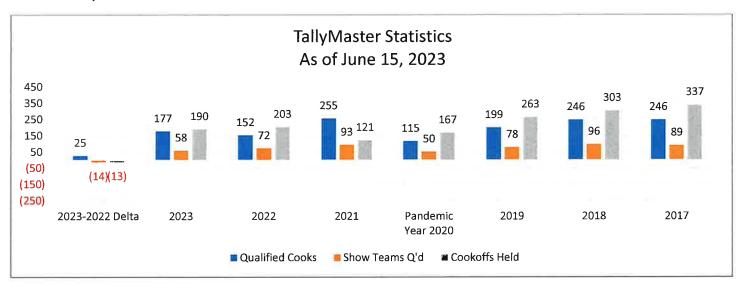

TERLINGUA TRAIL

Mike Watkins, Editor-in-Chief with Carol Knight, co-editor continue to do all the work on the Trails. Approximately 1200 trails are emailed each month to lifetime, annual members current in their dues, sponsors, corporate members and FOC members who are not members of CASI. The Trails is now sent in a compressed format with the hopes that not as many are kicked back by the members server.

Once emailed the publication is placed on the front page of the casichili.net website and posts are made on all CASI Facebook pages and Instagram. Cost for the Trail's publication continues to be minimal with an annual fee for the In-Design software license. This cost has been offset a little by business card size ads. The cost of the ad is \$50 a year and we currently have 2 ads which run every month. We have also received two POD ads that were larger than ½ page and those PODs paid for the additional space.

Sponsor ads continue to rotate and Michael contacts them each month to ensure we have the correct ad running.

There continues to be issues with emailing the trails to the members. Approximately 36% of lifetime members do not have an email listed. Almost all of the annual members now have emails listed. In addition, 15-20 emails are kicked back each month because they are bad addresses, or the email is not accepted by the recipient's server. In May, Michael and I traveled to the Ranch with Don and Dianna Hoy to take care of some things in the Flats.

- 1. Dianna and Michael did a complete inventory of all merchandise in storage at Krazy Flats.
- 2. Don and Michael installed a new TV bracket in the Saloon. This bracket will hold a television that was donated. The plan for this is there will be daily updates and pics that will slideshow all day. Powerpoints will have been created for each day announcing what events are going on in the Flats and what CASI events are happening each day that the spectators are allowed to participate in. Once we are in Terlingua this year, it is possible that because of the type of television it is, we may be able to stream the World Series Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evening depending on its schedule and if we can get the tv to tune in. If so, then it's possible that we can increase sales on those evenings.

Hopefully after TICC this year, we will be able to have the monies to get Phase two completed.
